

MILWAUKEE EDUCATION PARTNERSHIP (MEP) MONTHLY REPORT

January 2017

- Meetings and conversations were held between the Milwaukee Education Partnership (MEP)
 Executive Director, Gerard Randall, and various individuals within and outside of the
 partnership regarding education legislation, grants, partnerships, various initiatives and
 projects, updates, MEP administrative business and more.
- Ray Allen, Secretary, Department of Workforce Development, and Mr. Randall continued to discuss funding for youth and adult job training and employment.
- Conversations continued regarding possible MEP/UW System collaborations, including the
 convening of a summit to review new models and best practices for teacher certification
 programs.
- Dr. Vicki Martin, President of MATC, and Mr. Randall met and discussed the collaboration between the MEP and MATC, including how the MEP can support MATC programs and initiatives.
- Mr. Randall and the School Board's president and vice president met to discuss state and federal legislative initiatives.
- Mr. Randall and Kevin Festerling discussed private schools' initiatives in the Milwaukee area.
- Mr. Randall met with a number of people in Washington, DC including:
 - Congressman Sean Duffy regarding an invitation for him to visit Milwaukee Public Schools and public housing. The MEP will be organizing a tour of the City of Milwaukee.
 - Brandon Renz, Chief of Staff to Congresswoman Virginia Foxx, regarding planning for a visit to Milwaukee by Congresswoman Foxx who is the Chair of the House Education and Workforce Committee.
 - Maureen Hoyler, President, and Dr. Arnold Mitchem, President Emeritus, of the Council for Opportunity in Education to discuss future funding for TRIO and GEAR UP.
- The MEP convened two meetings in January of the governmental representatives of its Executive Partner institutions and organizations to share what their top state and federal legislative priorities are and why, identify legislative priorities held in common, and discuss

- ways they could work together as well as individually to better advance some of those priorities. Helpful information on budget processes, funding updates, resources and more was shared at each meeting.
- The MEP Executive Partners held their Annual Meeting on January 12, 2017. Updates on the work of the MEP and the first legislative priorities meeting were shared and various items were discussed. Executive Partners shared invitations to several of their upcoming events. Election of officers took place and the new officers are:
 - o President Dr. James Loftus (President of Cardinal Stritch University)
 - o Vice President Ashanti Hamilton (President of the Milwaukee Common Council)
 - o Secretary/Treasurer Earl Buford (CEO of Employ Milwaukee)
- Ryan Daniels, Executive Director, Milwaukee Public Library Foundation, and Mr. Randall met and discussions continued relative to planning of a new proposal focused on Birth-5 literacy for submission to the Campaign for Grade-Level Reading.
- Research continued concerning resource mapping and data collection and distribution models
 and tools. Meetings also took place with several people to gather additional background
 information on the data landscape in Milwaukee and share information about the MEP
 Birth-5 Literacy Initiative.
- Planning is in progress for the annual MEP HBCU Conference for 2017.
- New office space for the MEP is being sought due to the sale of the current office building for redevelopment as housing. A potential site has been identified in the same vicinity of the downtown area.
- Mr. Randall participated in the MPS Charter School Review Panel orientation.
